Celia Lehman Cherished Her Memories

As I recall, the first time I met Celia Lehman, at least in any formal and official way, was in 1996 at a Kidron Community Historical Society board meeting in the upstairs of the Kidron-Sonnenberg Heritage Center. It's not surprising she was there since she was one of the original board members and one of the longest running board members as well. I was being interviewed by the board for a position as the first Director of the Heritage Center. I don't remember much about the meeting, but I remember Celia's bluntness and enthusiasm for the Heritage Center. As I

recall, she was ready to hire me long before the interview was over. Thank you, Celia. You were always one of my biggest fans.

As I got to know Celia over the years, I discovered what many people already knew-she was passionate about Kidron history. She loved to tell stories about her younger years: walking to the one-room Kidron School from her home on Kohler Road, making Nothings and

Knee Patches, singing Swiss songs, hearing her parents speaking Swiss. She was full of stories about the days gone by, and in true Celia fashion, each time a story was told and retold, the details changed slightly. That was part of the Celia charm.

She was passionate about establishing the KCHS and promoting and protecting the collection of Kidron-Sonnenberg artifacts. Celia, along with Ruth

nonite Church Fellowship Hall and later in the upstairs of the Heritage Center.

She especially liked the old clothing and photographs.

Celia loved to talk to people and relay history to them: history of Kidron, history of artifacts, history of people and genealogies, history of churches and businesses. She liked to lead tours through the Heritage Center, showing off all the displays. She especially enjoyed talking to children about history, probably a remnant of her elementary

school teaching days.

She relayed history to people through her writing as well. She wanted children to love and understand Kidron history so she made history coloring books for them. She wrote history books for adults, too, as well as plays and articles for the Bit o' Vit.

Wayne Liechty said it well at her memorial service: "Without Celia's input, organizational skills, her drive, and

Members Banquet and Annual Meeting



Kidron Auction Celebrating 100 Years

The Kidron Auction, established in 1923 by Silas "Cy" Sprunger, is Ohio's oldest auction, and has been an integral contributor to the Kidron economy. Cy was well known for his bid-calling skill. On June 15, 1933, he set a world's record, selling 101 calves in 17 1/4 minutes.

After the passing of Cy in 1956, the auction was managed by Earl Sprunger (Cy's brother) and Russ Beals (office manager). In 1973, John and Janet Sprunger took on ownership of the Kidron Auction, and gradually added more land and buildings. John is the current owner and operator of the auction.

Cy promoted the building of the softball field in Kidron, and headed the construction of a pool on the auction grounds for water to be used for fire protection, and a lounge for small community events. Machinery sales benefited the KVFD.

Hay, straw and livestock continue to be on the auction block each Thursday; other auctions and events are often held on the grounds in the spacious and comfortable Sprunger Building.

1973 State Fastpitch Softball Champions

The players on the 1973 Kidron Merchants state championship team lived within a 10-mile radius of Kidron, at a time when other teams often recruited players from out of state. Bob Yutzy, Wayne Hershberger, Larry Zuercher, Jake Miller, Hartley Boss, Manager Elmer Stauffer, Bob Nussbaum, Cordell Boss, Duane Miller, Dave Miller, Aden Miller, and Harley Gerber were members of the championship team.




